

Bring Happiness with Rock Painting

Items Needed:

Smooth rocks or stones Acrylic paint Sponge brushes -



Directions:

Step 1: Find or purchase your desired rock (smooth and flat rocks work best). Clean it with soap and water and allow it to dry.

Step 2: Paint the top with a base coat of acrylic paint and let dry.

Step 3: When dry, add designs, or write a positive message. Add small details using a fine or extra-fine tip acrylic paint pen or a small paintbrush.

Step 4: Let it dry completely and then seal the rock to protect the design.
